o reinstate Monte Carlo to its rightful position, Chevrolet teamed with Magna/Decoma, a major supplier of appearance and performance components to General Motors. The result; the Monte Carlo Z/Sport Performance Package, available for 1995-96 Z34 models.

> Using a little advanced wizardry in induction and exhaust technology, the Z/Sport cranks out an extra 15 horsepower. And more is always better. Fitted to the special wheels are the latest in tire technology from BF Goodrich. A spoiler trims

off the Monte Carlo's slippery aerodynamic shape, and distinctive ID completes the picture. Order the whole Z/Sport Performance Package as one part number or pick up the items a la carte. More good news: everything except the intake and exhaust modifications will fit the Monte Carlo LS, too.

In Winston Cup circles (or should we say "ovals"?), the return of the Monte Carlo caused a major shift in the balance of forces. Once again, the ground shook and heads turned in awe. With the introduction of the Monte Carlo Z/Sport Performance Package, that phenomenon will no longer be confined to the track.

Seeing is believing: low-profile tires, wide wheels, a defiantly raked spoiler, dual exhaust and special badging. In the case of the Monte Carlo Z/Sport, super looks do mean super performance.

Get all the details. Or just the ones you want.

The Monte Carlo Z/Sport Performance Package is available as one part number, or you can pick the items a la carte. Order the package for the Monte Carlo Z34 you drive now, or the one you plan on driving. Individual components fit 1995-96 Monte Carlo Z34 and LS models (LS models make do with appearance upgrades only.)



Heavy Breathing

With careful attention to the ins and outs of "volumetric efficiency," the Z/Sport Performance Package results in impressive horsepower gains. The 3.4-liter double overhead cam V-6 puts out 215 hp in normal trim; in Z/Sport form, you're at a full 230.

May the downforce be with you. A common sight for Monte Carlo's NASCAR rivals is the rear spoiler. The Z/Sport version even comes with a light.



The job of getting the air through while keeping the dirt out goes to a high performance filter package. At its heart is a lifetime filter element.



A pulse-pounding delivery system

Enjoy a good old-fashioned rumble. The design intent of the "cat-back" exhaust configuration was to relieve back-pressure and finish the job begun by the high-efficiency induction system. Can we help it if it also sounds cool?



The Z/Sport hits the ground running on low-profile BF Goodrich Comp T/A tires measuring a healthy 245/50R16.

Open wide and say "16" x 7" wheels." The neat spokes and the bright-work don't actually add to performance, but they look like they do.

On the chance that a passing civilian might miss the spoiler, the trick tire/wheel combo or the take-no-prisoners note in the special Z/Sport exhaust, the package features distinctive name badging. We're just trying to be fair.
